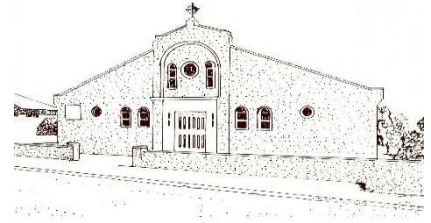

What do we believe about baptism?

“Holy Baptism is the **basis of the whole Christian life,**
the **gateway to life in the Spirit**
and the **door** which gives access to the other sacraments.

Through Baptism we are **freed from sin** and **reborn** as **sons and daughters of God;**
we become **members of Christ,** are **incorporated into the Church**
and made **sharers in her mission”**

Catechism section 1213



Canon law on baptism of babies also directs:

- Parents should take care that their babies are baptized in the first few weeks. They should approach their parish priest as soon as possible after the birth or even before it.
- The consent of at least one parent is required.
- There must be a well-founded hope that the child will be brought up in the Catholic religion or the baptism is to be delayed.
- At least one Godparent is required - who must be a practising Catholic over 16.
- Parents, Godparents and the parish priest are to take care that a name foreign to Christian sensibility is *not given*: at least one name must be a Christian name such as a saint's name.
- The normal place for baptism is the parish church of a child's parents.
