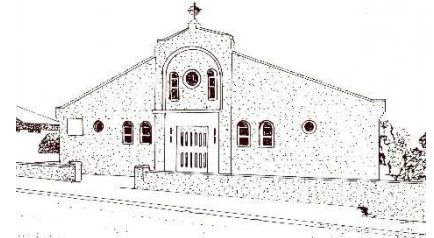

What do you want?

At the recent Winter Conference for young Catholics, one of the priests speaking made everyone laugh: he pointed out that Jesus' first public words to those seeking him were - 'What do you want?' It sounds grumpy: don't bother me!

Well of course it wasn't like that. St John the Baptist had just pointed Jesus out to St Andrew and St John and they went straight to him.

So often in the gospels, Jesus uses questions to draw people further: 'Rabbi where do you live?' 'Come and see'. So these two first apostles are drawn further. They learn that they can only get to know the Messiah, the Lamb of God, by meeting him and spending time with him.

It is not the only time Jesus asks those who come to him what they want even though it is obvious. Think of the blind man for example. As that blind man is drawn to express his need, he begins to open up to the God in front of him.

Jesus asks us all too: 'What do you want?'

We might have been coming to Sunday Mass all our lives. But at the start of the year we are invited to reflect once more on our relationship with him. What do we want? It's not a stupid question. It echoes though our spiritual lives. It draws us to spend more and more time with this Christ who captivates us and saves us.
