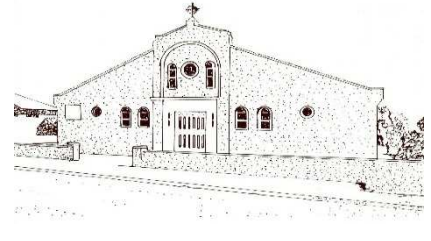

A 'ten-minute rule' bill on Tuesday 23rd October will seek to decriminalise all killing of unborn children in our country. Getting married in Church



Recently in the Sunday Gospel we heard Jesus' wonderful and clear words on marriage. They have been the foundation for all our teaching on marriage ever since.

At this time of year couples often approach their parish priests about getting married. It's a moment of great joy and hope.

It's good to be reminded of some of the basic things that we do hold to as Catholics:

Because we believe marriage is so important, as Catholics we are obliged to be married in a *Catholic Church*, unless we have permission from our bishop, in order for it to be recognised by the Church. (If we have not been married in Church, we should get the marriage officially blessed - a 'convalidation'. It's normally easy to do this by contacting our parish priest and means we can then receive Holy Communion).

Where *both* the man and woman are validly baptised, the marriage is a *sacrament*. This means the relationship becomes a place where Jesus works through all the joys and challenges to bring the couple closer to God. In fact the marriage becomes a sign of the Christian covenant – of Jesus' relationship with his Bride, the Church.
