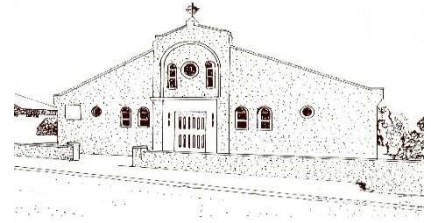

## Our parish day-trip to Chideock

On Friday we made our way to this Saxon village near Bridport, to the shrine of the Dorset martyrs. After our mass in the historic church, parishioners gave us coffee and a tour of the church and we finished with a pub lunch.

The village once had a castle owned by the Catholic Arundel family. But over the period of 55 years after the Reformation, three groups of men heroically gave their lives rather than betray their Catholic Faith. We are certainly blessed to have their witness in our county.



In 1587, **Fr Thomas Pilchard SJ** courageously returned to England after exile for his faith when it was illegal to be a Catholic priest here. As chaplain at Chideock castle he won many converts including a carpenter, **William Pike** and gentleman **John Jessop** before all were captured.

In 1594 **Fr John Cornelius SJ** from Bodmin became chaplain to Lady Arundel. He and two servants **Patrick Salmon** and **John Carey** were betrayed by a servant. A relative of Lady Arundel, **Thomas Bosgrave**, offered Fr John his own hat as he was being led away. This was enough to arrest him too!

In 1642 **Fr Hugh Green** became a Catholic after studying at Cambridge and also served as chaplain at Chideock. But the Puritans revived the law against priests. Opportunity did not knock for Fr Hugh who was not able to escape in time from Lyme Regis (that pun should have me arrested).

Whilst William Pike died in prison, all the other seven were brutally hanged, drawn and quartered at Dorchester. Fr Hugh Green's head was even used as a football by the contemptuous mob. Dame Elizabeth Frink's statues commemorating the martyrs stand near Gallows' Hill in Dorchester.

All were beatified in Rome, the last five in 1929 and the first three in 1987.

Charles Weld (grandson of Thomas Weld from Lulworth) designed and decorated the church himself to replace a barn where mass was said. It was consecrated in 1872 and is an unusual mix of Romanesque, Baroque and Gothic.

If you have five minutes when you are travelling through Chideock, why not turn off at St Giles' Anglican Church on the main street? The Catholic church is only 500 yards or so down the lane on the right, at the end of a tree-lined walk. It's open every day. It is full of statues and paintings and has a distinctive, rich, dark and prayerful atmosphere. Please God it will remain open.
