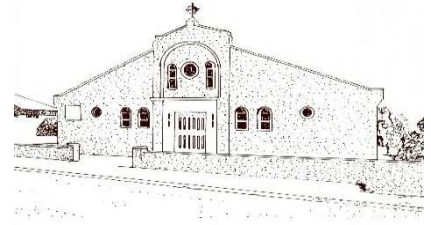

### **Our churches are to stay open**

The bishop contacted us to say the Government's Coronavirus *Places of Worship Task Force* met last week. The officials noted that keeping places of worship open for public worship provides recognised benefits for the community. (We are blessed that our Government here in England acknowledges this; public mass has been stopped in Scotland).

The bishop reminded us however that we need to follow the rules on going home immediately Mass ends and not mingle with one another, either immediately outside the Church or in car parks.

### **Is watching online 'as good' as being at Mass?**

We all appreciate watching mass on our screens, but ultimately nothing substitutes for actually being present. St John Vianney used to compare private prayer and the power of being at Mass with the difference between lighting a single straw and a bonfire; it greatly empowers our prayer. Our churches are *safe places* and getting to mass if we can is of unique value. Here's a call to focus on the light and not on the darkness.
