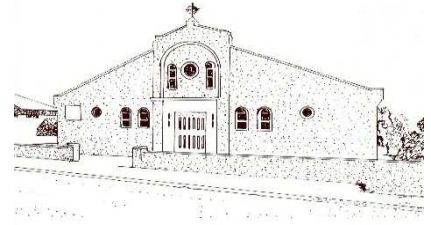

### **Directives from the bishops on lockdown end**

Twelve pages have arrived as we are going to print. We will try to summarise these in next week's newsletter, but the general principles are for local responsibility with a phased return to pre-covid practices. Based on the directives, we can consider how we will gradually return to normal.

### **Fatima : Latest film just released in UK**

We now have the DVD. It is visually stunning, on location amongst the Portugese hills and olive groves. The three child actors are excellent. The basic message is relayed, but some details have been changed. It's disappointing that there is no real reference to the childrens' heroic response to the visions (Jacinta and Francisco were the youngest canonised saints). The action seems heavy and disjointed. The decision to avoid special effects might leave more to the imagination, but you can't help thinking that if done well, especially at the end, CGI would have enhanced rather than hindered the film's power. ### **Receiving Communion: our shared responsibilities**

Whilst it is a beautiful thing to receive Holy Communion if we can, it is not essential to receive every time we come to mass; we should always be in a 'state of grace' for Jesus in Holy Communion. If we are living in a sexual relationship that is not recognised by the church (a church marriage) we should not receive Holy Communion. This is for our own good: St Paul teaches us that there are the most serious spiritual repercussions for us if we receive when we shouldn't.

If a family member or friend isn't aware of this, we would be doing them a great service by pointing them to our faith about Holy Communion, in a gentle, non-judgmental way; that we can always go up for a blessing until our life situation squares with Jesus' teaching. If we don't point it out to them, who will?
