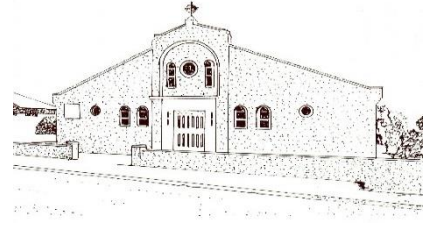

Christ, King of the Universe

Why did Jesus come to us? Why did God become a man? Was it just to die and save us all from our sin? Or is Jesus *much more* fundamental to creation? The first Christians certainly believed the whole universe was made for Jesus. It was a British theologian, Blessed Duns Scotus (1266-1308) who taught that God would always have become man whether-or-not the human race had sinned, because he loved us so much. We can go even further and say, because God has made us with bodies, we 'need' God to have a body too so we can relate to him and he can share God's life with us. This is also why we need the physical contact of the sacraments – our living link with Jesus. It gives us a thrilling vision of Jesus: everything is called into being for Him, truly King of all.

The Cathedral of Christ the king in Liverpool is famous, but we have three churches with that dedication in our diocese: one in Plymouth, one in Perranporth and one just up the road in Bournemouth.
