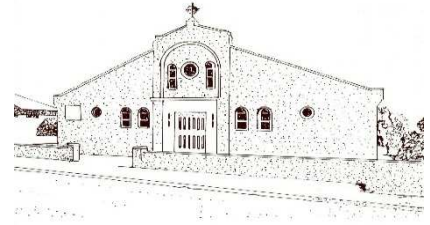

### **The Easter Triduum : places are limited this year**

We need you to book for Easter Vigil Mass 8.30pm at SJ and Easter Sunday Mass at both parishes. ***The Good Friday Service is full.*** Call the office during office hours only or email us. Please give names of everyone in your party. *Registration closes on Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> March at 12noon, or before when Masses reach maximum numbers.* We are not asking you to book for the Holy Thursday Mass (7pm on 1<sup>st</sup> April).

### **National Day of Reflection: next Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> March**

The Prime Minister has asked for this on the first anniversary of the first lockdown, with a minute's reflection at midday and some sort of national commemoration at 8pm.

Our Bishops, however, are asking all Catholics to *pray*, mindful of the needs, hopes and sorrows that have emerged over the last year:

"March 2020 was the first time our churches had to be closed. It is our hope that on this day, every one of our churches will be open. We invite everyone to enter a church on this day, to reflect and pray **in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.**

"We know this will involve an extra effort, but this can be part of our important contribution to a significant moment in the life of our country. Indeed, we ask that you might invite a friend, neighbour or colleague to come to church with you as you make this visit."

*We aim to have both our churches open all day, with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for much of the day. If you can sign up (in the porch) for a time of adoration, it would greatly help this initiative.*

### **Year of St Joseph: quote of the week**
