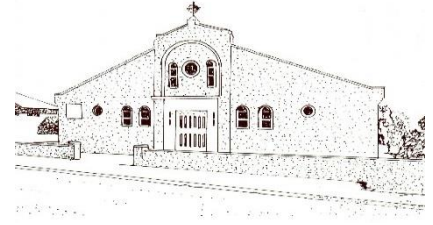

Finding the way to respond to suffering

Watching the scenes in Afghanistan and in the light of the shootings in our own diocese, we are confronted with yet more signs of horrific suffering. Sometimes we watch journalists interrogate members of the clergy after such events: how can Christianity respond. Will it provide only platitudes? Clergy can even feel pushed into saying their faith 'has also been shattered', as though our religion (as the secular media hope) is really just a fairy-story for the feeble-minded, unable really to handle the worst tragedy and pain.

Clearly, we never wish to speak unthinking and empty patter on such occasions, especially to victims and their families. But don't we in fact have a unique resource to call on? In every church, a crucifix hangs centre-stage.

Whilst the God who speaks to us promises salvation, for now in this life he suffers with us; he himself has endured the worst extremes of pain and promises to be with us and win through. In the strange events that we all must live through as human beings, our faith in fact never ceases to provide a strength, consolation and meaning that nothing else can give. “Darkness does not have the last word” as Bishop Mark said in his homily. Sometimes the most powerful help we can give as Christians, as history has borne out over and over again, is to be a constant, loving and often wordless presence of hope to those who suffer. We embody in ourselves what Jesus is for us: the Lord who in his risen body bears the wounds of the cross.
